The visit of the Chinese delegation marks a significant step towards strengthening professional ties between Pakistan and China in the domain of law enforcement. The agreement and planned training initiatives will greatly contribute to enhancing the professional capacity of police officers through international exposure, exchange of knowledge, and collaborative research.



Visit of Syrian Delegation Headed by Mr. Ziad-Al-Ayesh Deputy Minister of Interior of Syrian Arab Republic at NPA

On 23rd July, 2025, a delegation visited the National Police Academy, Islamabad.

The visit commenced with a briefing session about the Academy's history, structure, and role in the professional training of police officers across Pakistan. The delegation was informed about various courses, particularly those designed for senior police officers, with emphasis on modern policing techniques, community policing, counter-terrorism strategies, and human rights practices. After the briefing, the delegation visited different facilities of the Academy including the Training Block, Sports Complex, and Auditorium. They were given an overview of the curriculum, training methodologies, and practical exercises that ensure the development of leadership and operational skills among trainee officers.

The Syrian delegation appreciated the professional standards, discipline, and training infrastructure of the National Police Academy. They acknowledged Pakistan's efforts in strengthening policing institutions and expressed keen interest in fostering cooperation in the following areas:

- Participation of Syrian police officers in short-duration capacity building courses.
- Lectures and knowledge-sharing through video link sessions.
- Signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on mutual cooperation between the two Police Academies.

The visit concluded with an exchange of souvenirs and group photographs, marking the beginning of stronger professional ties between the Syrian Police institutions and the National Police Academy, Islamabad.



Study tour of OCIC-28 Military Police School Dera Ismail Khan (Criminal Investigation Course)

On 5th August 2025, the participants of the 28th Orientation Course on Criminal Investigation (OCIC-28) Headed by Lt. Colonel Farrukh (Chief Instructor) visited the National Police Academy, Islamabad. During the visit, a comprehensive briefing was delivered regarding the Criminal Investigation process in Pakistan.

Arrival of 3rd STC DSsP U.T. of Balochistan Police

The officers will be trained in legal subjects, academic modules, and physical training. The Specialized Training Course is a structured development programme, combining classroom-based learning with practical fieldwork. The duration of the course is 61 weeks. The course comprises of four interconnected phases, namely Foundation (6 weeks), Development (26 weeks), Field Attachment (25 weeks), and Consolidation (4 weeks).



Final Physical Exam of 2nd STC of DSsP U.T. of Sindh Police

On 18th August, 2025, the Final Physical Examination of the 2nd Specialized Training Course (STC) for Deputy Superintendents of Police (DSsP) of Sindh Police was successfully conducted.
