

Profile of the Fazl-i-Hamid, Course Commander, NPA

SSP Fazl-i-Hamid, PSP, is a senior police officer with more than fifteen years of accomplished service in the Police Service of Pakistan. Currently serving as Course Commander at the National Police Academy, he leads the Initial Command Course, mentoring Assistant Superintendents of Police and shaping the future leadership of Pakistan's policing system.

He holds a Master's degree in Terrorism, Security and Society from King's College London as a prestigious Chevening Scholar (2018–19), with a focus on state failure, governance, and counterterrorism. Earlier, he earned a Bachelor's in Computer Software Engineering from Foundation University, Islamabad, where he graduated with a Gold Medal, merit scholarship, and multiple distinctions, including leadership roles in student societies.

Over his career, he has served in pivotal roles such as AIG Operations South Punjab, SSP Counter Terrorism Department Islamabad, DPO Attock and Bannu, SSP Special Branch Rawalpindi, and AIG HRM/Operations in the National Highways & Motorway Police.
